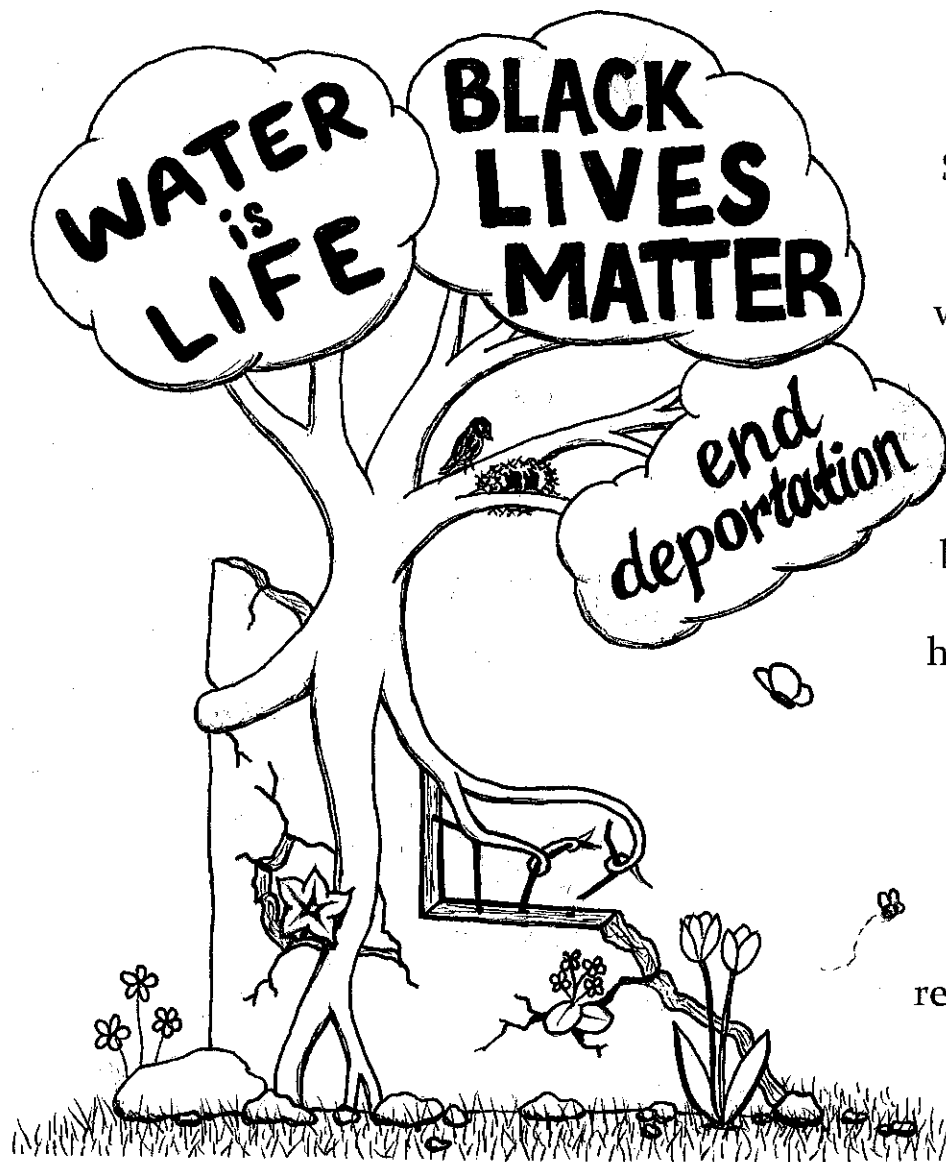


Racial Justice and Quaker Abolitionism for the 21st Century
